INTRODUCTION TO STAINED GLASS

Make a beautiful Art Deco Flower panel. In this class students will learn to cut, grind, foil and solder the glass used to create a glass panel. The project piece will include the use of zinc which strengthens the whole project and allows students to attach hangers and a chain. All materials included and tools are supplied, but tools and supplies are available for purchase from instructor if desired.

BEGINNING STAINED GLASS

Students will make a glass panel using the copper foil technique. This class will teach you all the skills needed to create a beautiful panel using various glass elements such as bevels. This panel will be framed in zinc to make it stronger and to allow it to hang the piece when finished. All materials included and tools are supplied, but tools and supplies are available for purchase from instructor if desired.

FUSED GLASS CLOCK

Keep time with a unique clock in this fun class. Students will cut and layer glass in their own personal clock design. Special dichroic glass will be available to add sparkle in just the right detailed way! Clock project pieces will be taken to be fired, drilled and have the clock movement installed at the instructor's studio and returned to the Museum for the students to pick up at a later date. All materials included and tools supplied.

FUSED GLASS PENDANTS

Students will make several fused pendants out of decorative dichroic glasses. Keep one and give one as a gift! Students will finish and fire at least one pendant in class. The remaining project pieces will be taken to the instructor's studio and fired and returned to the Museum for the students to pick up at a later date. All materials included and tools supplied. Chokers or sterling chains may be purchased from the instructor for a small fee.

FUSED GLASS TILES

Students will make a unique 4 inch fused glass tile using pieces of colored glass, frit (powdered glass), stringers, and cooper sheet. The project pieces will be taken to the instructor's studio and fired and returned to the Museum for the students to pick up at a later date. Tiles will be mounted in a wood frame that can be hung on a wall if desired. All materials included and tools supplied.



SCULPTURE

A \$20 material fee is included in all courses held at the Flatlander facility. This is to provide incidental materials and supplies needed by the students in the course of taking sculpture classes. Students will purchase project supplies from the instructor.

MIXED SECTIONS

BEGINNING & INTERMEDIATE

Lost was bronze casting using ceramic shell, does it get any better than this?!! Work in the infamous Flatlander foundry and create cast metal sculpture much the way it has been done for thousands of years with a late 20th century twist! This course covers all the techniques from the wax to the marble base. Students are encouraged to cast multiple pieces. Students need to bring leather work gloves, safety glasses, disposable respirators and ear plugs

THINWALL CEMENT OVER

STYROFOAM (ALL LEVELS)

This is a great way to make larger scale sculpture that is inexpensive and plenty durable to be outdoors! This method works in both directions as it is both subtractive and additive. All materials supplied, but bring work gloves, disposable respirators and safety glasses.

CERAMICS

Students will begin with moist block clay and learn to create functional, decorative and sculptural forms while building their own aesthetics for this media. Commercial or pre-designed molds and glazes will not be used. Clay and tools may be purchased from the instructor. Clay \$12/25lbs

Welcome Toledo artist, Matt Squibb, as he demonstrates his simple method of screen printing on clay. Matt uses a thermo fax machine to burn an image for use in the screening technique. Matt will demonstrate in the morning and participants will learn the techniques through "hands on" printing using the provided ceramic bisque tiles and under glazes. The Museum will fire all completed workshop tiles. Limit 16 students.
