Clock project pieces will be taken to be fired, drilled and have the clock movement installed at the instructor's studio.

Beginning Jewelry Class

This class will explore the art of fused glass jewelry. Students will learn to cut, shape, grind and fabricate fusible glass materials to create simple jewelry designs. Each student should expect to complete several earring pairs, a pendant/necklace and several pins. All materials included. Come and make some great gifts!

Ceramics

Students begin with moist block clay and learn to create functional, decorative and sculptural forms while building their own aesthetics for this medium. Students will learn handbuilding with a variety of clays using methods of pinch, coil and slab. Throwing on the potter's wheel, trimming and surface decoration will be taught at the beginning student level. Students will glaze all work and use the Museum's studio glazes and fire in oxidation.

For individuals who have mastered the techniques of throwing, hand building and glazing, this class will provide methods, projects and information which will encourage the student to further skills and knowledge pertinent to ceramics. All work will be glazed by students and fired in oxidation.

Sculpture

A \$20 materials fee is included in all courses held at the Flatlander facility. This is to provide incidental materials and supplies needed by the students in the course of taking sculpture classes. Students will purchase project supplies from the instructor.

Stone Carving (Beginning & Intermediate)

This course will address all the traditional methods of hand and power carving and many non-traditional methods. Beginning students will carve limestone while experienced students will work marble. Each student will complete at least one 100 lb. piece. Students need to provide: leather work gloves, safety glasses, disposable respirators and ear plugs. Tools and finishing supplies will be provided by Flatlanders and stone can be purchased during class.

Mold Making
