Registration has never been easier with four ways to register: (1) in person, (2) by mail, (3) by telephone (517-787-2320) using your credit card during business hours only (Monday-Friday 10:00-4:00, Saturday 11:00-4:00, or (4) by fax (517-787-2933) anytime. Full payment must accompany each registration. (Early registration is recommended; classes fill quickly.) Contact the Museum for more information at (517) 787-2320.

• Enrollment in children's classes is determined by grade students will be entering in the fall. (Pre-school enrollment is determined by age.)

Preschool = 2 ½ - 5 years old or entering kindergarten.

Art & History Camps= Entering 1st grade – entering 6th grade (unless otherwise specified)
